The following actions have been taken by the Division following hearings conducted before an Administrative Law Judge and the respective Licensing Committees or Boards or have been entered by Stipulation or Memorandum of Understanding from July 1, 2007 - September 30, 2007.

PHYSICIANS/SURGEONS

ANDREW, Larry Glen, DO

Springville, Utah

Cause of Action:

Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct in his practice as an osteopathic physician/surgeon.

Order:

Respondent's licenses to practice as an osteopathic physician/surgeon and to administer and prescribe controlled substances were revoked with a stay of enforcement on the revocation. Said licenses are suspended pending the completion of a psychosexual evaluation. Following the period of suspension, said licenses will be placed on probation for five years with conditions and restrictions.

Reinstatement Order:

The probation on Respondent's license to practice as a physician/surgeon was terminated and said license was reinstated with full privileges.

Order:

Amended Order:

A license to prescribe and administer controlled substances Schedules II-V is to be issued to Respondent upon the receipt of an application for a controlled substance license and appropriate fees. Said controlled substance license is restricted for use in a supervised residency program only. Respondent also has additional conditions to be met as a result of the controlled substance license being issued.

NOTE: No license to prescribe and administer controlled substances was ever issued to Respondent by the Division.

Cause of Action:

Between May 2006 and August 2007 Respondent on two occasions prescribed a Schedule IV controlled substance to his spouse despite not having a license to administer and prescribe controlled substances. During that same period of time, Respondent also telephone local pharmacies on at least four occasions and provided the name of another prescribing practitioner as the prescribing physician in order to obtain the Schedule IV controlled substance for his spouse. The prescribing practitioner whose name Respondent used had no knowledge of the prescriptions and did not authorize the use of his name.

Order:

Respondent voluntarily surrendered his license to practice as a physician/surgeon and any residual rights he may have with respect to a license to administer and prescribe controlled substances. Respondent may not reapply for licensure for a period of five years.

Respondent's licenses to practice as a physician/surgeon and to administer and prescribe controlled substances were suspended pending the final resolution of administrative action against his licenses.

Sacramento, California

Cause of Action:

In June 2005 Respondent voluntarily entered into a Stipulation and Order in Case No. DOPL-2005-149 in which his Utah physician/surgeon license was suspended pending the outcome of a California disciplinary proceeding. On January 31, 2006 Respondent's Utah suspended physician/surgeon license expired when it was not renewed. In November 2006 Respondent surrendered his California medical license to resolve the pending disciplinary action in that state.

Order:

Respondent voluntarily surrendered any residual rights he may retain with regard to his license to practice as a physician/surgeon in this state. Respondent agreed not to reapply for licensure as a physician/surgeon in Utah until such time that his California medical license is reinstated or until such time as he can provide evidence to the Division and Board that he is capable of safely practicing medicine in Utah.

After Respondent has worked as the Medical Director at Vivace Spa for a period of six (6) months, he is required to commence the required outpatient substance abuse program. It was further ordered that Respondent's license to practice as a physician/surgeon was placed on probation for five (5) years retroactive to November 22, 2006, the date on which all required renewal fees were paid as provided in the October 6, 2006 Amended Order.

Without admitting or denying the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained in the May 25, 2007 Emergency Order, Respondent agreed to the following:

Respondent voluntarily surrendered his licenses to practice as a physician/surgeon and to administer and prescribe controlled substances. Respondent may not reapply for licensure for a period of ten years from the Order date.

In June 2006 the United States Coast Guard reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank that Respondent had failed to meet standards of care for periodontal disease diagnosis, demonstrated general lack of thorough treatment planning and documentation, placed patient safety at risk by failure to determine the need for bacterial dental endocarditis prophylaxis and performed dental extractions that led to an adverse outcome. **Without admitting or denying any wrongdoing, Respondent agreed to the following:**

Order:

Respondent voluntarily surrendered his license to administer and prescribe controlled substances in Utah. Respondent also voluntarily surrendered his Class I anesthesia permit associated with his Utah dental license. Respondent's license to practice as a dentist in Utah is restricted to the non-clinical practice of dentistry. Respondent shall not examine, diagnose or treat any clinical patient.

Following the period of suspension, said license will be placed on probation for five years with conditions and restrictions.
