On November 26, 2007, several changes were made to the Utah Construction Trades Licensing Act Rules. **These changes affect you and your license.** Keep in mind that it is Unlawful Conduct under 58-55-501(2) of the state code to act in a construction trade beyond the scope of the license held and Unprofessional Conduct for a licensee under 58-1-501(2)(i) of the state code to practice an occupation beyond the scope of the licensee's competency, abilities or education. The following license classifications have been eliminated or changed:

S215, S270, S271, S274, S281, S282, S283, S284 and S285.

S215: The former S215 (Solar Energy Contractor) has been changed to Solar Thermal Systems Contractor and those that held this license classification will retain it. However, there is a new S202 Solar Photovoltaic Contractor license classification.

If you want to continue doing Solar Photovoltaic work you will need the S202 license classification. A S215 contractor holding an active license, on November 26, 2007, may be qualified to obtain the new S202 license classification. A S215 contractor that has two years of full time work experience, in the past ten years, doing Solar Photovoltaic work can obtain the S202 license classification at *no charge* by filling out the enclosed affidavit and returning it to the Division no later than March 31, 2010.*

S270: The name of the S270 license classification has been changed from (General Drywall, Stucco and Plastering Contractor) to General Drywall and Plastering Contractor and those that held this license classification will retain it. However, there is a new S600 General Stucco Contractor license classification.

If you want to continue doing Stucco work you will need the S600 license classification. A S270 contractor holding an active license, on November 26, 2007, may be qualified to obtain the new S600 license classification. A S270 contractor that has two years of full time work experience, in the past ten years, doing Stucco work can obtain the S600 license classification at *no charge* by filling out the enclosed affidavit and returning it to the Division no later than March 31, 2010.*

S271: The S271 Plastering and Stucco Contractor license classification has been eliminated. Those holding this license classification will automatically be given the S270 license classification by the Division. However, there is a new S600 General Stucco Contractor license classification.

If you want to continue doing Stucco work you will need the S600 license classification. A S271 contractor holding an active license, on November 26, 2007, may be qualified to obtain the new S600 license classification. A S271 contractor that has two years of full time work experience, in the past ten years, doing Stucco work can obtain the S600 license classification at *no charge* by filling out the enclosed affidavit and returning it to the Division no later than March 31, 2010.*

S274: The S274 Drywall Contractor license classification has been eliminated. Those holding this license classification will automatically be given the S270 license classification by the Division.

S281, S282, S283, S284, and S285: The S281 Single Ply and Specialty Coating (Roofing) Contractor, S282 Build-up Roofing Contractor, S283 Shingle and Shake Roofing Contractor, S284 Tile Roofing Contractor and S285 Metal Roofing Contractor license classifications have all been eliminated. Those holding these roofing license classifications will automatically be given the S280 General Roofing Contractor license classification by the Division.

* Those wanting the S202 Solar Photovoltaic and S600 Stucco license classifications after March 31, 2010 will have to make application, pay the required fees and meet the current standards of this license classification as outlined in R156-55a-302b of the Utah Construction Trades Licensing Act Rules.
