MINUTES
Harold weight made a motion to approve the December 2008 minutes. David Kingery seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

COMPLIANCE

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

There was a request from Steven Bankhead in the previous meeting in which he requested a change in the wording on feeder cables in the Administrative Rules which allowed for additional unlicensed labor on large wire pulls. Rydalch made a motion to let the present rule stand with no changes. Kingery seconded the motion all members voted in favor.

CONTINUING EDUCATION APPROVAL

IEC

Mike Schauerhamer came before the board as an instructor representing IEC of Utah to be eligible to teach the NFPA 70E standards class for trade related continuing education credit. Schauerhamer gave a list of his credentials and explained his experience. Burton made a motion to accept Schauerhamer as an instructor for IEC of Utah. Rydalch seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

Village Electric

Dirk Burton expressed concern on the true and false questions for the correspondence continuing education course for Village Electric. Burton made a motion to not accept Village Electric as the continuing education provider with Gregory A. Shaw as the instructor due to unsatisfactory curriculum content. Kingery seconded the motion and all members voted in favor. National Code Seminars was assigned out to the board for review. This will be an agenda item for next month.
