The minutes of September 4, 2004 were reviewed and approved as written.

Swear in New Board Members

Ruth Amy Shapiro, Sue Petty, and Susan Bradshaw were sworn in as the new Board Members.

New Chairperson

Mr. Hickok was elected as the new Board Chairperson

Discussion of the Profession Mr. Jones explained that this was the required once a year Board meeting. There are 50 licensees. Mr. Jones updated the Board on the Sunset Review and combination of Boards. Mr. Jackson explained that the Legislature is discussing removing all sunset dates, as the legislature can review a profession at any time.

Ms. Petty indicated that most people entering the profession are interested in meeting the court requirements and not DOPL requirements.

The Courts have their own requirements to be on the ADRP roster. There are approximately 200 people on the court roster. The Board would like to have the courts require a person hold a certification in addition to being on the roster. A person must pass an online test on ethics before being placed on the roster. The Board Ms. Zenger would like to see the requirements for ADRP be raised to the level on the courts. The courts require a person to be involved in three mediations a year to stay on the roster. Some people do not do three mediations a year, making the requirement difficult.

Mr. Jones explained that most professions have an education requirement and a good moral character requirement. The statute as written does not protect the public.

Ms. Zenger asked what the process is to change the statute. Mr. Jones explained that it is meaningless to increase the standard since the certification is voluntary. Mr. Jones explained that they should go through the sunrise process to increase the license requirements, but they should build the profession first.

Mr. Jackson suggested that for the next meeting a person from the courts should be invited to attend to help with the discussion. Mr. Jones suggested that the associations put together a plan for how to restructure the profession.
