**MINUTES:**

## FLOW AND WATER CONSUMPTION

Commission felt there are more efficient way of saving water. Kerry Cramer pointed out that most of the water use is outside, however, the plumbing codes do not have jurisdiction on water outside of the house. Ray Moore raised a concern that the proposal only allowed one program to certify plumbing fixtures when there are several other programs available. Jeff Pederson spoke to the committee about the concerns the plumbing contractors have in connection with this proposal.

Following the discussion on the proposal, Kerry Cramer made a motion to table the decision on this proposal until the next meeting. Ray Moore seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

## PLAN REVIEW OF THE 2009 INTERNATIONAL PLUMBING CODE

Dan Jones gave an overview of the work that needs to be done for the review of the existing amendments for the 2009 International Plumbing Code and also the dates that the review needs to be completed by. Presently there are 64 existing amendments to the plumbing code and 18 amendments to the residential code.

Ray Moore informed the committee that he will be reviewing all of the amendments since he is on the Utah Chapter amendment committee.

Nathan Lunstad volunteered to review Chapter 6. It was pointed out that before any changes could be made to this section, DEQ would have to approve them first.

Ray Moore volunteered to be on the Task Force to study the residential fire sprinkler requirement.

## GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER ESTABLISHING AN ETHICS POLICY

Dan Jones explained that this is an executive order that the Division has been asked to share with all committees and boards. He asked those present to review the material and if they had any questions to contact him.
