TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

DECISIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

ADMINISTRATIVE BUSINESS:

Mark Steinagel spoke to the committees in connection with SB211 and what the advisory committees and the Uniform Building Code Commission will need to do for the report to the Business and Labor Interim Committee.

MINUTES:

A motion was made by Dave Webster and seconded by Clark Peterson to approve the minutes from the May 12, 2009 meeting as written. The motion passed unanimously.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

PRESENTATION FROM STATE ENERGY OFFICE

William Chatwin and Kevin Emerson gave a presentation on the significant changes between the 2006 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) and the 2009 IECC.

Mr. Emerson pointed out that if the 2009 IECC is amended to be a less restrictive code, it will be not meet the 90% compliance for the stimulus package.

Mr. Chatwin pointed out that to qualify for the stimulus money, the state energy program has to have 90% compliance within 8 years. There has to be a plan in place to progress towards compliance.

Following the presentation by Mr. Emerson and Mr. Chatwin, those present discussed the impact of adopting the 2009 IECC. The committees concluded that more information is needed regarding the financial impact of adopting the 2009 IECC.

Another joint meeting is planned for July 7th at

which time more information can be presented before the decision is made on the recommendation for the 2009 IECC. The State Energy Office was asked to come back to the July 7th meeting with estimates on costs to go from the 2006 to the 2009 IECC.

ADJOURN: The meeting adjourned at 2:20.
